Discussion

• Councilwoman Wickenheisser has heard concerns from local business owners regarding signage and lighting on Main Street. Council President Binkoski expressed the need to have consistent interpretation of the Ordinance for proper enforcement of the rules. Councilwoman Vasquez would like the rules to apply the same way for all businesses and suggested a packet of information should be given to new businesses before they open to help them understand what the rules are. Mayor Chegwidden suggested forming a committee, to include local business owners, and determine what is not currently conforming to our ordinance. The committee would report back to the Council. Attorney Hirniak indicated he would need to look at the ordinance and explained the Governing Body sets the ordinance and our professionals interpret and enforce the rules. There may be a need to change the ordinance, rather than deal with enforcement, if it doesn't accomplish what the Council wants it to.

It was agreed Councilwoman Wickenheisser would chair the committee. Council President Binkoski and Councilwoman Vasquez would serve on the committee, along with Zoning Officer Lewthwaite and local business owners. The committee will report back to the Mayor and Council in November.
