- Update to alcoholic beverages ordinance: Mr. Hirniak advised that he spoke with Chief Young and Ms. Evangelista about updating the ordinance to allow for those with outdoor dining permits and are BYOB restaurants to have the consumption of alcohol in accordance with the BYOB laws in their outdoor dining areas. Council President Binkoski thinks this is a good idea to give direction for our officers and the restaurant owners. Councilwoman Hayes likes that it gives clarity. Mayor Chegwidden thinks it helps our businesses.

\section*{Council Reports}

Council President Binkoski: The warm weather has given the DPW the opportunity to complete a lot of projects around town to beautify things.

Before we hire a new one, we want to have a discussion with the public about what they are looking for from the Library so we can carry out their vision with the new Director. The Virtual Summer Reading Program will begin on June \(29^{\text {th }}\) and they will have free to-go lunches for kids at the Library from July \(6^{\text {th }}\) August 14 \({ }^{\text {th }}\) from 11:30-1 p.m.

Councilwoman Wickenheisser: Thank you to the Police Department for their food drive and to all of the people who donated to the drive.

Councilman Yeager: No report.
Mayor Chegwidden's Report: Thank you to the Police Department for the food drive. Similar to what we did with our Main Street Committee, we would like to do the same thing and request public input about our Library going forward. He will be
appointing a few people to that committee soon and they will work on bringing the public in. He received a letter from the State about the Rt. 80 and Rt. 15 interchange project. The packet he received was anywhere from 300-500 pages and asked us to provide them with any comments with 30 days. If any of the Council wants to review it, we can send them the link. The project is moving forward and will help alleviate some traffic in town since you won't have to cut through anymore. He received a letter from a resident, Zachary Orr, who asked if we would put a Pride Flag up in town during Pride Month. Mayor Chegwidden thought that the Council would likely be in favor of it and we have a flag pole near Maria's Pizza that can be used. He asked if anyone has any comments and no one had any so he will let him know that it is okay. Mr. Orr recently received an award from the Police Department and he thinks that this will be a nice thing.
